




- •70% of respondents felt girls face more difficulties than boys and men in reaching positions of leadership.

On Thinking Day 1974 Olave Baden-Powell was honoured with a United Nations Medal known as the Ceres medal, an award given annually to a woman who had made a substantial contribution to nutrition and rural development worldwide.

As a further attempt to raise international awareness, 1 million small aluminium replicas of the medal were donated by the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the UN, to be distributed to Girl Guides/Girl Scouts throughout the world. Like the medal itself, these replicas depict the face of The World Chief Guide, representing Ceres, the Greek Goddess of Agriculture, and, on the reverse, 3 girls of Brownie, Guide and Ranger age and the inscription 'Towards Food, Education, Employment for All'.

A number of the replicas remained unused and we offer one to you today as a memento. It is a gift, but if you would like to throw a coin into the buckets at the door when you go out, all the money received will go to the WAGGGS Global Girls Fund.
