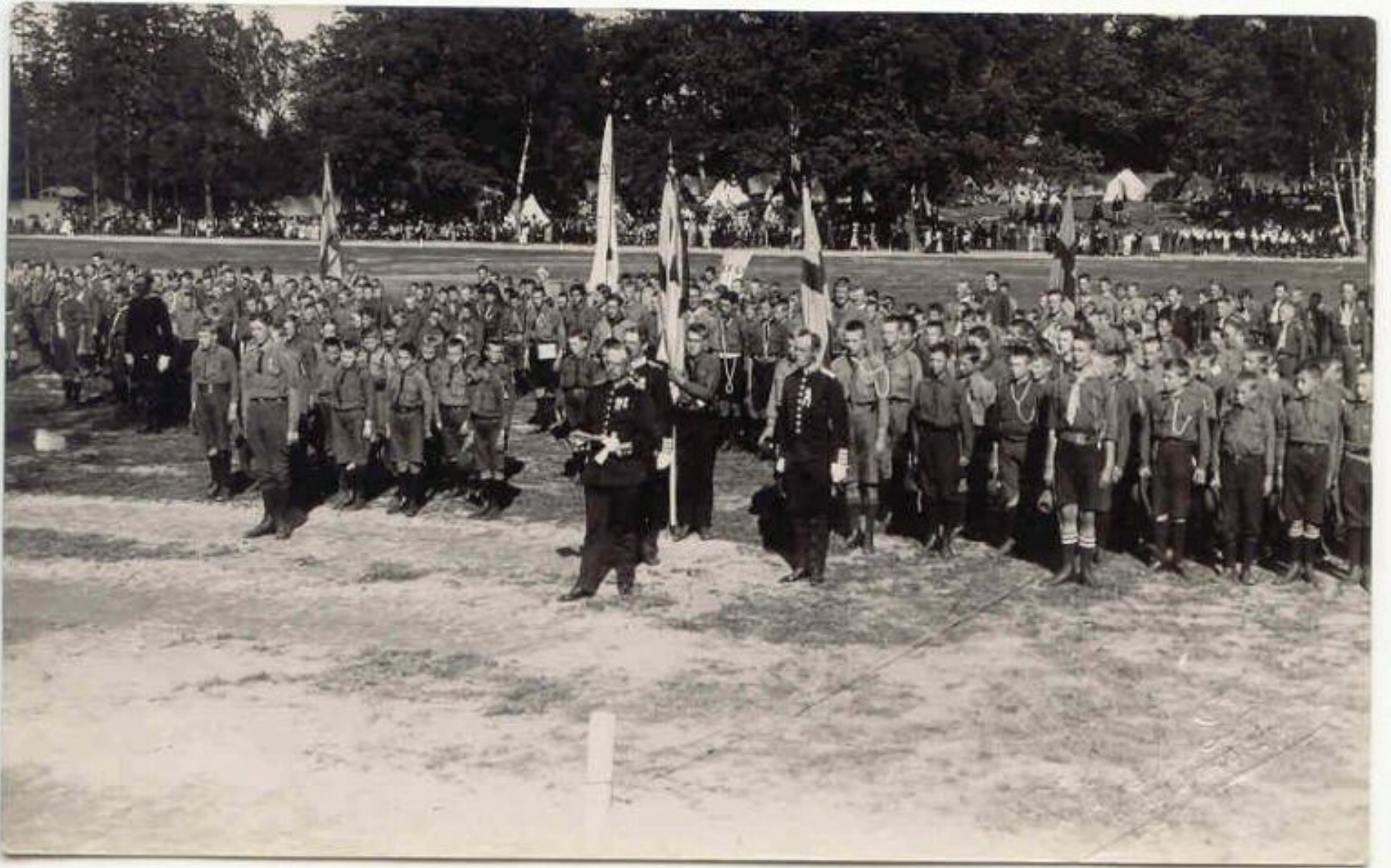


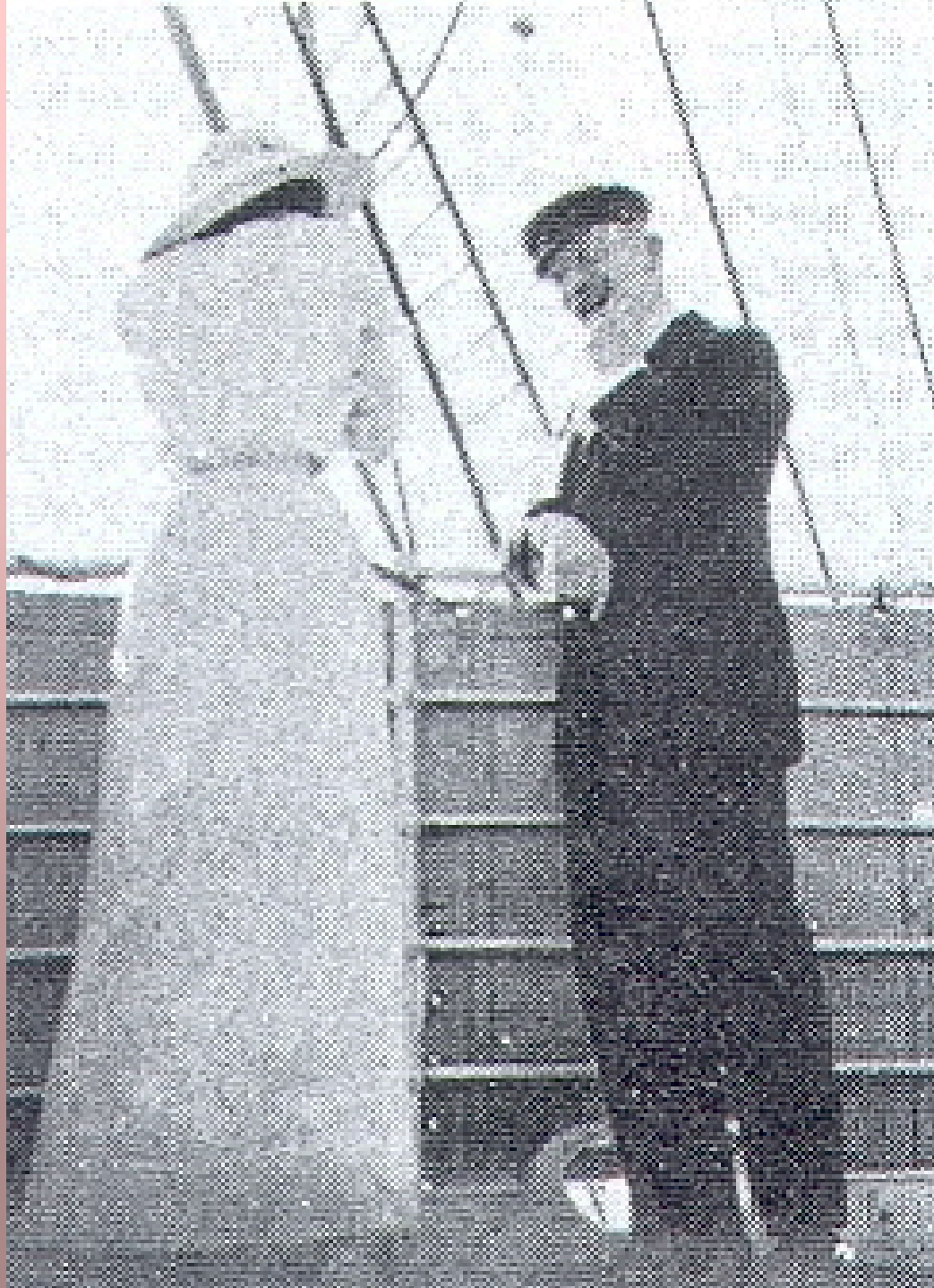

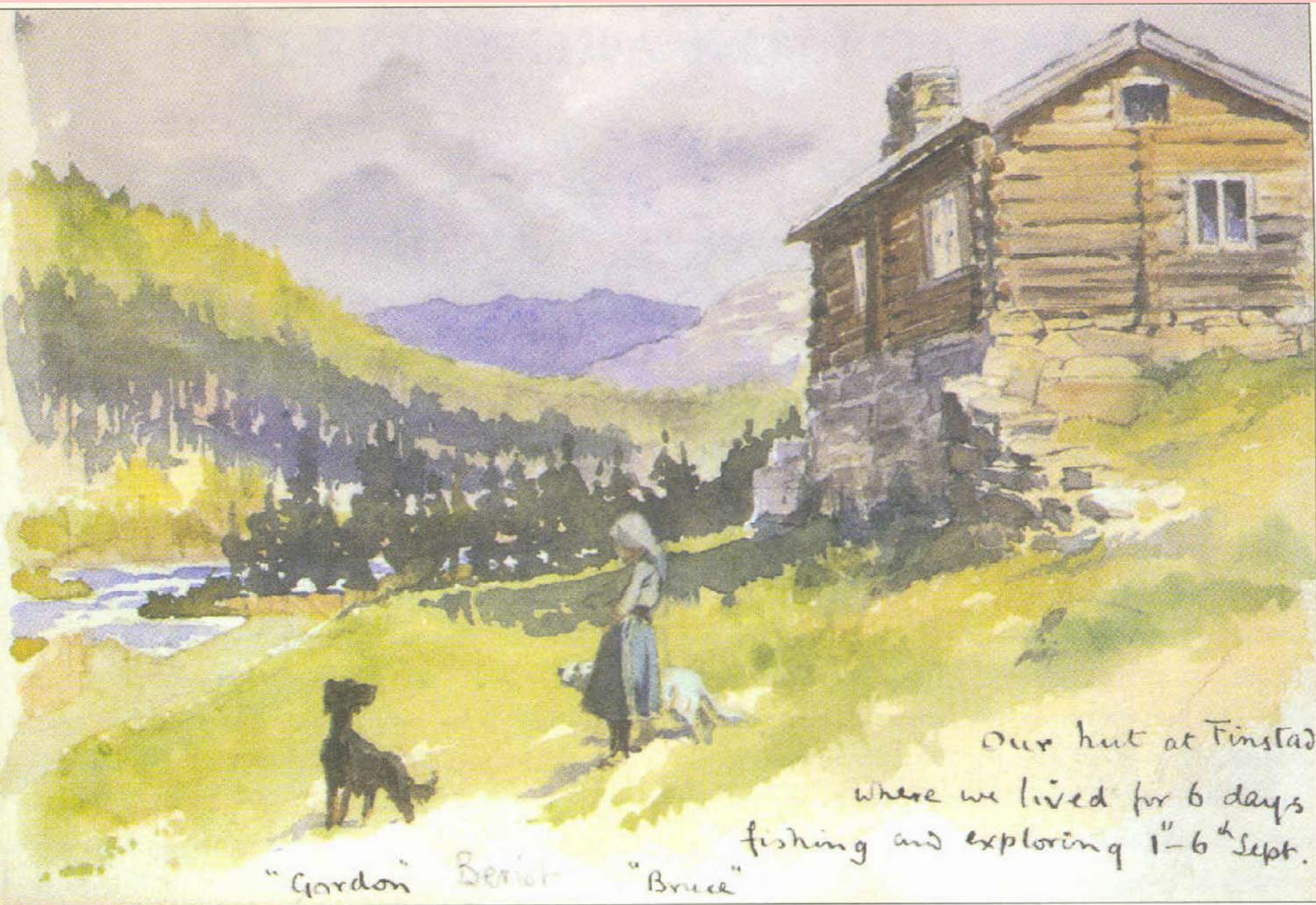
How interesting that the little hut

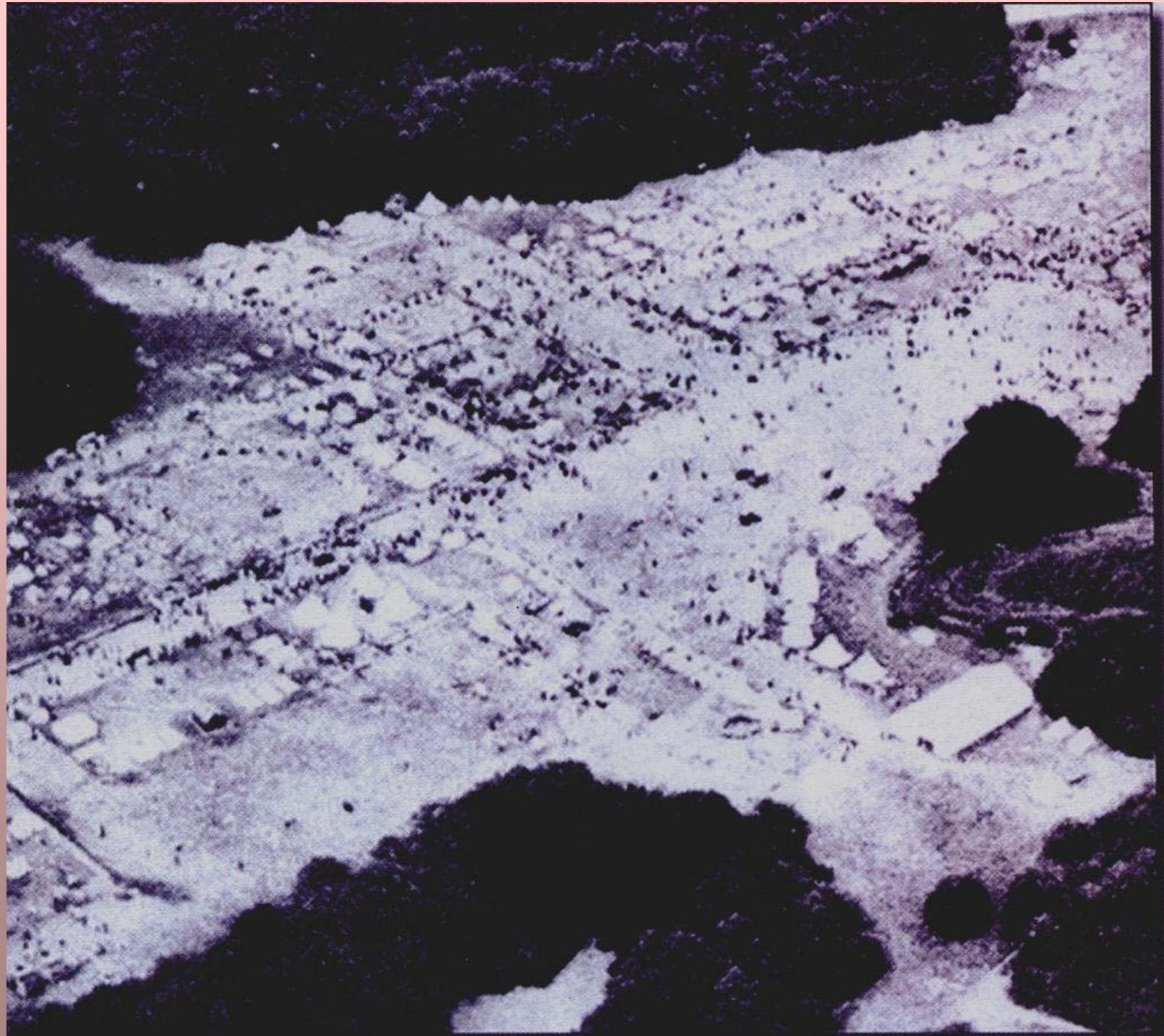


Wembley, 1924. The Chief with Scouts of 23 countries.
